2022 IMPACT REPORT

This was a year of celebration at Mane Stream. We turned 50 and spent the year commemorating all of the important people and milestones from our five-decades long history. We are the 2nd oldest center offering adaptive riding and therapy services in the country, and are excited and humbled to know that our programs have been an important part of the lives of thousands of children and adults with special needs, and their families over the years.

In 2022, all of our programs recorded an increase in participants. Our adaptive riding program has been having a growth spurt since 2020 and we continued the trend this year, providing lessons to 93 riders throughout the year, an increase of 15 riders over 2021. Therapy services continues to have residual challenges from the pandemic but we provided therapy in two disciplines for 34 clients, 13 of whom were new to our practice.

The 10 weeks of summer camp filled in record time, and we welcomed 54 children with special needs and their typically developing peers. Campers included siblings and, for the first time, cousins. The two advanced rider weeks offered a real glimpse into what it takes to care for a horse, day in and day out.

Our field trip program expanded in 2022 to include five different schools as well as our friends from the Adult Day Center of Somerset County and Community in Crisis. Horses for Healing, our riding program for individuals living with cancer started up again with 6 participants over two sessions.

We were most excited to celebrate our generous community in 2022. From our volunteers who consistently give their time so that our participants have the very best experiences in our programs, to our donors who overwhelm us with their generosity and who believe so strongly in our participants, we know we are very lucky to have you.

Thank you to everyone who helped get Mane Stream to where we are now. Whether you played a larger-than-life role or were with us for only one week of summer camp, you are an important part of our history and we truly could not have made it this far without you.

SUMMER CAMP IS A HOT TICKET!

For the second year, spots in summer camp filled within 2 weeks of registration opening. Campers of all abilities learn all things "horse" including how to give a pedicure.

Theme weeks encourage imagination and add to riding lesson fun. For the first time in 2022 we had not only siblings attend but cousins too!

36% of our campers enjoy their time on the farm so much that they attend for 2 weeks.

2020s

2020 - Closed for 12 weeks due to the PANDEMIC! Offered virtual therapy services and other virtual programming (barn talks, game nights, cooking classes, story time around the farm, etc.) to keep participants connected.

2021 - 1st time two riding instructors teach 5 days a week as riders return en masse as pandemic

2022 - Field trip program serves record number (218) of participants including Girl Scouts, senior adults with dementia, people in recovery and both typically developing and special needs students.
